This eight-night safari includes a three-day visit to Lamai Serengeti, the loose setting for the 'Pride Lands,' as it is the home of herds of lions, zebras and wildebeests. Lamai Serengeti can be found amongst the rocks of Kogakurla Kopje which offers panoramic views, and is just a few miles from where the migrating herds cross the Mara River and gigantic Nile crocodiles lay.
